

SCHOLARSHIPS OFFERED IN THE SCHOOL OF SURVEYING AND SPATIAL INFORMATION SYSTEMS

Co-op Scholarships

The UNSW Co-op Program is a scholarship program setup by industry and the University to provide money and industry training for selected undergraduate students. Co-op Scholars receive a tax-free scholarship of \$9,500 per annum and undertake three 10-week industry training placements during their degree program during which time they will be paid an additional minimum of \$550 per week. Students expecting a UAI of 90 may apply.

Rural Scholarship

The Faculty of Engineering Rural Scholarships Program is designed to assist students living in rural or isolated areas to study at UNSW. Rural Scholars receive a tax-free scholarship of \$9,000 per annum available for four years. Students expecting a UAI of 90 may apply.

RTA Scholarship

The Roads & Traffic Authority Scholarships have been established to encourage students to undertake studies in the School and industrial training at the RTA. RTA Scholars receive a tax-free scholarship of \$15,250 per annum available for four years and undertake three 10-week blocks of industrial training over the vacation period at the end of years 1, 2 and 3. Students expecting a UAI of 90 may apply.

Peter Angus-Leppan Scholarship

This scholarship worth \$8,500/yr for 4 years will be awarded to an Australian citizen based on academic merit, reasons for undertaking the program, leadership qualities and some consideration will be given to social or economic circumstances which may hinder successful transition to UNSW. Applications close 31 March.

NSW Country Surveyors Association Scholarship

\$4000 (tax exempt) per annum for up to three years, subject to satisfactory progress + matching \$4000 from School of SSIS. The selected student will need to demonstrate a desire to become a Registered Surveyor in NSW and to return to regional or rural NSW to practice.

Board of Surveying and Spatial Information Scholarship for Women in Surveying

The scholarship, worth \$2000 for one year only, is available to a female student entering first year of the full-time degree program in Surveying and Spatial Information Systems at UNSW. Selection will be based on academic merit. Applications close 31 March.

Institution of Surveyors Scholarship

Applicants must be proposing to undertake full-time study in the Bachelor of Engineering - Surveying and Spatial Information Systems. The scholarship of \$1,500 for 1 year is renewable subject to satisfactory progress. Each applicant will be assessed on the basis of academic merit, personal qualities and financial need. Applications close 31 March.
